The Calgary Board of Education acknowledges the traditional territories and oral practices of the Treaty 7 Nations, including the Siksikaitstapi, comprised of the Siksika, the Kainai, the Piikani, and the Amskapi Piikani Nations. 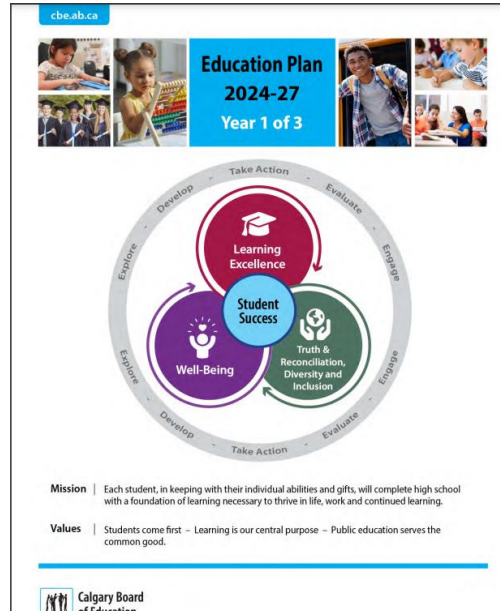
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School Planning and You



School Development Plan

A school development plan is an action plan for a school that outlines how student learning will improve over time. The SDP is supported by school data and is connected to our CBE Education Plan.





How is Our School Development Plan Used?

- Guides ongoing assessment and review of goals and actions.
- Our school development plan is the driver for closing learning gaps and informs:
 - Instructional strategies
 - Professional learning
 - School structures and processes for learning
 - Resources to improve student learning
 - Data-informed decision making

School Development Plan – Outcome



Students will use explicitly taught discourse strategies to communicate their mathematical understanding.

School Development Plan – Outcome Measures



- Report Card Data (K-6 Number Strand)

School Development Plan – Data for Monitoring Progress

- Teacher Professional Learning Self-Assessment (Mathematics Frameworks/Math Up/High Yield Math Routines)
- Implementation of whole school math instructional practices
- Student work collected for Professional Learning Communities
- Classroom Look Fors (Mathematical Discourse)



School Development Plan – Actions

Learning Excellence Actions:

- Daily High Yield Math routines in all classrooms
- Teachers will use Math Up as a tool to support professional learning and task design
- Teach explicit discourse strategies (talk moves, Kagan Cooperative Learning)
- Students will develop their mathematical vocabulary through classroom discourse
- Teachers will calibrate their assessment and pedagogical practices



School Development Plan – Actions

Well-being Actions:

- Create a culture that values the thinking process and strategies for communicating mathematical understanding over speed and algorithms
- Students will experience productive struggle in learning mathematics
- Students will develop confidence in their mathematical abilities
- Social Emotional Learning (SEL) focused classrooms to promote equity in all classrooms (supportive classroom environment, integration of SEL into academic instruction, explicit SEL instruction)

School Development Plan – Actions



Truth & Reconciliation, Diversity and Inclusion Actions:

- Teachers will use teaching practices that develop discourse and linguistic skills for all learners
- Strength Based Learning Progression. Students and staff self-reflect on their learning (seed-sprout-sapling-tree) to create universal tiered strategies that develop decolonized assessment practices that are responsive to student needs and experiences
- Provide professional learning and resources to build and apply culturally responsive teaching and learning

Our School Budget

- Our school received **3,695,747** in 2024-25 to provide a quality education to our students and meet the goals in our school development plan (SDP).
- At least 75 per cent of budgeted funds covers **staffing** and the remaining portion covers instructional and operational **supplies**.



Our 2024-25 School Fees

We will consult with families by outlining proposed activities for the upcoming year that may require a fee for cost recovery.

Our 2024-25 School Fees

There is a process for approved school fees in CBE.

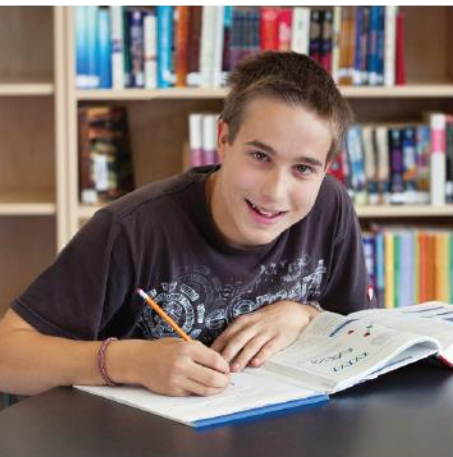
Next Steps

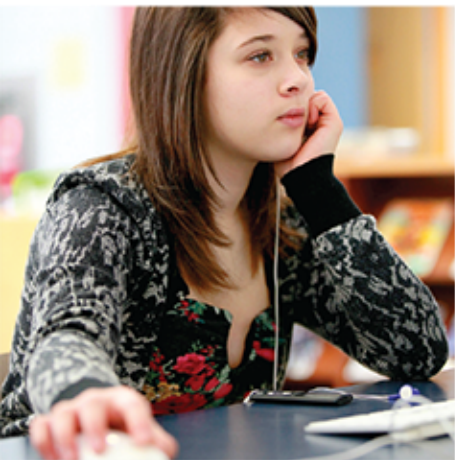

Supporting CJM Parent Society - The society earns **\$60,000** or more per casino. These funds help provide the school with technology items (such as: Ipods and Chromebooks), transportation for field trips, and other educational resources.

Our fundraising society is provided a casino **once every 3 years**. In order for it to be successful, it is crucial that we get all volunteer positions filled. Schools who have access to casino fundraising are very fortunate. *If we do not have enough volunteers we will lose this privilege and will no longer be invited for future casino fundraisers. This would make field trips, technology purchases, and fun school activities hard to access at CJM school.*

There is *no training needed*, and a casino worker is on site at all times to assist with all positions. Positions include: General Manager, Banker, Cashiers, chip Runners, and Count Room positions.
